
## Review in The Daily Telegraph



Jack Omer's debut album, The Music of Joanna, is an assured work and a promise of fine things to come. The Hertfordshire-based singer, who is doing a PhD at Kings College on Anglo-Jewish anti-Zionism, uses strong musicians (including Neil MacColl and Kate St John) on a well-produced record. The melodies are strong

and inviting, as on the opening track Something Wicked This Way
Comes, and Omer has a good voice. With Strange Are The Ways and
