The last few years have been spent studying music at the Music Academy at North Hertfordshire College, singing at various charity events i.e. Karen Millen's Teen's Unite and also performing for the Italian Embassy. She has also been an Ambassador for 3Music, a local singing competition for the last 6 years, event managing across Hertfordshire.

Having just turned 18 Roxy is hoping to make a career in the music business, she regularly performs live in-between college and holding down several part time jobs. Teaching herself to play guitar and actively writing her own material she recently won Search for a Star in Hatfield singing her own composition Summer Sun and a mashup of her own songs and well known artists such as Taylor Swift, Ed Sheeran and Miley Cyrus.
